### 2009

In 2009, as a harsh economy devastated families in poor communities, CJI turned its attention to the growing number of criminal justice policies that further undermine family stability. With an eye toward regional and national movement building, we funded organizations that educated and engaged broad constituencies to contest the most egregious of these practices. Our priorities included immigrant detention measures that separate parents from children with inadequate due process of law; legislation that strips incarcerated and formerly incarcerated people of their rights as citizens, workers, and parents; and school practices that label and criminalize young people.
